
















Lord, I Have Cried































Let Every Breath Praise the Lord

The high praise of God shall be in their throat, and two-edged swords shall be in their hands,


To do vengeance among the heathen, punishments among the <u>peoples</u>, To bind their kings with fetters, and their nobles with <u>manacles</u> of iron.
